Her first full length play *Child Light* will be performed as a rehearsed reading in Project Arts Centre at 11am on Saturday 19th of September as part of 2009 ABSOLUT FRINGE. She is an Artist in Residence for Fingal County Council and in this capacity will be launching a Fingal Youth Theatre in early 2010. Aoife has also previously directed in the Finborough Theatre, London.

Alena Lindsay is a writer and producer. She co-founded Little Flute Productions a site-specific theatre company which had their debut production in the Chapelizod Festival this year with Carmel Rooney's one woman show *One to Tango* as well as developing a handful of other short and long works for production in 2010.

Aoife and Alena are preparing to launch a "Women in the Arts, Ireland" membership organisation to represent and promote female artists modelled on the success of similar organisations in business and technology.

As a trained theatre practitioner, mediator and facilitator Aideen McDonald uses theater and applied arts techniques to work with various single identity groups addressing issues of social justice and personal growth. Aideen is currently developing a piece of inter-active theater with young women involved with the juvenile offender's diversion programme in Dublin 7. This work has been awarded a development award from CREATE. Recently she has worked with Integrating Ireland, the Arts for Peace Foundation, SPIRASI, the Rape Crisis Center, the Glencree Centre for Peace and Reconciliation, RoI & NI and Hydebank Wood Young Offenders Centre, Belfast. In 2008, Aideen received Arts Council funding to facilitate and participate in applied theater work in the central prison Beograd, Serbia. Twice Graduate of Trinity College Dublin (MA Classics & French / MPhil Reconciliation Studies) she has also studied performance at RADA and the Gaiety School of Acting.

Madame Butterfly is her debut as an independent live artist. This piece looks at identity construction focusing on gender. In its site specific context and its aesthetic, namely the world of glamourised prostitution; the red-light district, brothel window and the world of the Geisha, the piece highlights the world of a sold sex. The audience is engaged to differing degrees of intimacy. Voyeurs experience is transparent but two-dimensional. The more underground establishments on this lane, the Boilerhouse sauna and the Emporium lapdancing club have been set up for the sensual / sexual enjoyed of men. MB only services women. During the twice nightly, facilitated, one-on-one encounters, MB will be engaging her female clients with a view to provoking self-analysis around the areas of identity, intimacy and artifice. The majority of MB clients have been invited. They are women from across a broad section of society who work with or live with issues directly affecting women.

Carpet Theatre (formerly BDNC Theatre) was established in 2002 to produce new and devised movement-based work for theatre and non-theatre spaces. They have created eleven diverse and successful shows, touring in Ireland, Wales, Bulgaria, Romania, and the Czech Republic. Artistic Director Ciarán Taylor trained at Ecole Jacques Lecoq and the University of Kent. 'Carpet theatre' can be performed where there is space to play and people to watch.

The Blanch (ABSOLUT FRINGE, 2009) is a grotesque bouffon comedy about shopping, inspired by the Blanchardstown Centre and originally commission by Fingal County Council In 2008. Ferry Tales (June 09) was a site-specific performance in Dublin Ferry Terminal sponsored by the Dublin Port Company. In 2008 Carpet Theatre was commissioned to devise a site-specific performance called Wexford Fire Station Tour for Wexford County Council, which explored the station and its function through movement and live music, and the site-specific 50 Ways to Leave Dún Laoghaire which took over the Ferry Terminal after hours. Croi Glan is a physically integrated contemporary dance company working with both disabled and able-bodied dancers. Croi Glan is based in Cork and was co-founded in 2006 by Tara Brandel and Rhona Coughlan.

David Bolger, Artistic Director of CoisCéim Dance Theatre, has choreographed a piece combining an infectious energy with depth and sensitivity. *On the Wall* finds its trigger in the perceptions and feelings we have about our place in the world. Premiering at this years Cork Midsummer Festival "with impressive grace" (Irish Times), through poignancy and humour it investigates the potent cocktail of identity, sexuality and politics mixing to form the tension between self-image and other's image of us.

Having completed a very successful week working with integrated dance pioneer Adam Benjamin in August, the ABSOLUT FRINGE performance will be the culmination of their busiest year to date premiering three new pieces at Cork Midsummer Festival, Clonmel Junction Festival and Tallaght's Civic Theatre. Tara Brandel choreographed the companies' first aerial work, *Edge*, with Geneviève Mazin as aerial mentor, which was an instant success with the audiences at Clonmel. The company's honesty in the desire to tell a story and the understanding that everyone has a story to tell means they produce work that is accessible to a wide range of audiences, including dance, theatre and, quite excitingly, non-dance audiences.

Daguerreotype is a new theatre company founded in early 2009, Dan Bergin & Mary Sheehan (Drama and Theatre Studies, Trinity College, 2009), Colm McNally (Scenography, University of Aberystwyth, 2012) and Ed Collins (Communications, DCU, 2010). The company was founded on the basis of being a design based ensemble, by which we mean to challenge the usual actor and text based company format, instead preferring to emphasise the design elements of the theatrical arts. Simply, we are a designer's theatre company.

Daguerreotype's first show, as a company, is *Wozzeck*, a piece of original writing from company founder Dan Bergin. Although the show draws its name from the Alban Berg opera and is heavily influenced by Georg Büchner's original, unfinished, *Woyzeck*, Ireland's Celtic Tiger and subsequent recession have left their unmistakeable marks on this production. This promenade style performance uses a clean, sharp, industrial look that the audience are encouraged to explore.

This *Wozzeck* is a true reflection of Daguerreotype, using strong writing to push stage design and audience experience to the forefront.

Deliberately crossing sectors, mixing groups, working with all ages, amateurs and professionals, in varied locations, he specialises in innovative creations inspiring a world of possibilities.

Jouissance Productions formed in early 2008. Their debut piece, *The Woman Who Left Herself*, premiered at The Dublin Fringe Festival '08 and put this young Company on the map. It sold out within the first week of the Fringe and went on to win Spirit of The Fringe. They were then invited to bring the piece to Shunt Lounge in October '08 and due to popular demand brought it returned to Dublin in February for another sold out run at a new location. The performance was an intimate encounter taking place within the setting of a birthday party in an old run down house where guests' sat round a table and witnessed as a girl, the live body, interacted with her former self, a film version of herself seated at the other end of the table.

Now, in a joint presentation with ABSOLUT FRINGE and Project Arts Centre, Jouissance return with *Lavender*. Usually working in off-site non-conventional theatre spaces, the challenge was to maintain the intimacy at the heart of their work and a sense of discovery within the neutral and popular performance space of Project's Cube. *Lavender* was born out of a questioning of the written word and its inability to keep time with the live body. This is told through the story of an unborn life, a life that is foretold in dreamed premonitions and the decision or not to be born into the "writing" of our lives....

Jouissance's work begins with a desire to capture a specific mood/atmosphere. Space and image inform this and are then layered with whatever elements are necessary to bring this atmosphere to life - in the case of *Lavender* - music, film, animation, movement and words. Their work aims to be an encounter between audience and performance.

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Lisa Tierney-Keogh's new play, *Four Last Things*, will receive its world premiere at the ABSOLUT FRINGE. The play is directed by acclaimed actor Garrett Keogh making this a remarkable father/daughter collaboration on Lisa's sixth stage play.

Four Last Things explores the relationship between a young girl and her father in the last days of her heartbreaking battle with depression. A stirring and achingly true play, Four Last Things has three characters, and is written so the design of a production can be as small or large as imagined. This world premiere production of Four Last Things has received a great deal of support and encouragement including AWARE, a charity that works to defeat depression and suicide.

Lisa has trained with the Lee Strasberg Theatre Institute in New York and The Second City. Her work has been performed at the Crypt Arts Centre, Dublin, Draiocht, Soho Theatre in London and the Project Arts Centre, Dublin. Lisa won the Irish Times/ESB Theatre Awards Bursary 2002 and was nominated for the Stewart Parker Trust/BBC New Writing Award. In 2009, she was short-listed for the BBC Tony Doyle Award. Lisa is currently engaged in the inaugural New Playwrights Programme at the Abbey Theatre in Dublin.

Loose Canon was founded in 1996, and has garnered a reputation for provocative, absorbing, and rigorous theatre. The Company pursues an evolutional and adaptive approach to making work. From its passionate productions of Elizabethan and Jacobean texts to the full-time ensemble it maintained from 2000-2004, the company has always been committed to experiment and risk-taking in the field of performance. Recent productions include *Phaedra's Love* (Winner of Irish Times Best Production Award for 2008), *The Maids* (2007), *The Duchess of Malfi* (2006), *Medea* (2005) and *H* (2004).

The Piggyback Project

New times call for new ways of making work. And so, as part of ABSOLUT FRINGE 2009, Loose Canon are presenting two new shows, by two cutting-edge directors, which will share designers, cast, space and time in order to serve audiences with a double helping of work from one of Ireland's most exciting theatre companies.

The main show, *Anatomy of a Seagull,* directed and adapted by Jason Byrne after Chekhov, is a forensic examination of death by a thousand cuts, adapted from Chekhov's classic. Monsters and Players was established in 2008 by Eoghan Carrick, Roisin Kehoe, Sarah Madigan, Anna Ovakimjan, Kevin Wallace and Marilena Zaroulia. We share a commitment to devising practices and new dramaturgies emerging

from conceptual material, texts, physical actions and the use of light, sound and space. Although our work has been conceived in response to non-theatre venues, we do not consider ourselves as an exclusively site-specific company.

The dramaturgy of *a moment of suitable silence* emerged from the combination of verbatim and physical theatre principles. The process of moving from the real to the fictional while generating material and composing the piece led us to encounter the possibilities and impossibilities of performing around real stories.

Our major influences include Grotowski's and post-Grotowskian principles of physical actions, Forced Entertainment's non-acting, Tim Etchells' performance writing and Complicite's devising practices.

Future plans include a double project-curated event (staging a canonical text alongside an installation inspired by the same source), followed by the diaries of that project and an autobiographical performance. By means of an interrogation of form and content, performance for Monsters and Players will always be the space of human contact, a space of exposure and embarrassment, of sharing and listening.

Created with fun and love and framed by manic ambition our work is visually electrifying, drenched in substance and socially engaged. The aim of the company is to make theatre that us and our friends would like to go to. We want to get people in who don't normally go to see things in the theatre and to bring a new audience. We're all under 21 and we have TWO shows in the ABSOLUT FRINGE, both relevant to our lives and the lives of young people.

ROUGH is written and directed by Grace Dyas and designed by Doireann Coady. "Love does a tab of acid and tells us everyone lies. Slip the tongue; too much fast food. Avoid mentioning dips in mood. You're a slut, but hey, you're young. FUCK POSTMODERN. FUCK POPULAR CULTURE. FUCK TALKING ABOUT IT. FUCK ANYONE YOU LIKE." Rough is epic. It's an epic about creating epic, living epic, being epic. It sounds like electro, tastes like cigarettes, feels like cold concrete under bare feet and sees this town with filthy eyes.

As part of ABSOLUT FRINGE Shane will perform in *Group Therapy for One*, a show about his life, his problems, his fears and feelings directed by Grace Dyas and set in the kitchen of his family home. The idea for the show is really based around the idea of a young man talking openly. Of course, *Group Therapy For One* is by no means a lecture, we've taken this idea and wrapped it up in fun and humour and stories!

Talking Shop Ensemble

Talking Shop Ensemble is a theatre company founded by four Drama and Theatre Studies graduates of the Samuel Beckett Centre: Aisling Byrne, Oonagh Murphy, Robbie Sinnott and Lisa Walsh. The company was founded formally in 2008, having been in existence on an ad hoc basis since 2006. The group came together through a shared passion for theatre that expounds its position within the cultural spectrum, transgressing artistic, disciplinary and theoretical paradigms.

Talking Shop Ensemble aims to create work that explores the boundaries of the traditional performance space and engages with audiences in neutral or undiscovered spaces and the company is passionate about the collaborative work model. The work created by *Talking Shop Ensemble* to date is varied. However, the one common element may be seen as a focus on finding new ways of telling old stories. Recent work outside of Ireland includes *Le Voyage du Gulliver* (Dramatise, Paris); *MetroProject* (Mangiare, Paris); *Dans un Champ il y un Vache* (film, Paris); *The Disney Project* (film, Paris); *Hold On* (film, Paris); *The Blank Room* (Young Vic, London); and *To Have and to Honk* (Honk Project, London).

Current projects include a new devised piece on the Armada survivor DeCuellar with Kila and Donal O'Kelly; *The Arctic,* an Arts Council/Hawk's Well Theatre commissioned new work; a new *Honk Project* in London with the director John Wright; and a boufoon-panto with Maeve Ingoldsby and the Galway School of Performing Arts. Jaimie is also in pre-production for *The Job,* his first short film as a writer/director with Bandit Films.

Jaimie tries to focus his energies on creating new work that engages the actor's body and the theatre space in a dynamic way. He is particularly interested in using traditional performance styles in ways that resonate with the contemporary experience. His work explores themes of humanity and he tries to let humanity be a motor for his work. As a workshop facilitator Jaimie gives workshops in mask, in "play", in the dynamics of movement, and in

Her most recent production was The Silk Labyrinth which received funding from the Arts Council. Leonor aims to tour *The Legend of Zocor*ro in Dublin, nationally and internationally starting at Edinburgh 2010.
